The apparel and textiles industry in Bangladesh, employees over 4 million workers, the majority being women. The mandatory human rights due diligence (HRDD), was introduced in response to the persistent human rights concerns, including poor working conditions, low wages, and exploitation of workers. A greater industry awareness on the importance of HRDD is instrumental to its success. The HRDD can only be effectively implemented with a collective concerted effort from the Bangladesh government, international organizations, and companies operating in the industry.
